

FOREWORD

I've always embraced books, regardless of circumstances, and they've embraced me in return. Our friendship has had its complexities, but now I consider us inseparable. They've always been my solace, finding their place within me, guiding me to grow as a person. Thanks to books, I've been honored with the opportunity to share my story in the foreword of this year's annual report for Aasraa Trust.

It's not an uncommon story about the transformative power of education; however, it's one that is closest to my heart. It's extraordinary in its ordinariness, where miracles unfold.

My family's unstable financial standing led me to leave school after class 4. In a village, this is not considered a major issue. In 2019, I moved to Dehradun with my mother but without the necessary documents. Being away from books, education and school felt like a punishment to me.

I couldn't get admission to a school. It was during this challenging time that I met a group of individuals whose only mission was to make sure that children like me are in school. Meeting them was the highlight of the day. My mother found out that this was the outreach team of an organization called Aasraa Trust. This was a godsend!

My mother put her faith in them. They got all the necessary paperwork done so I am eligible for school. They not only helped me secure admission but also recognized my potential. They enrolled me in something called a Mobile Learning Centre—a bus with a little school in it. There were books, pencils, colors, toys for learning, and a giant TV screen fitted behind the driver's seat.

From not being able to get an admission in school to studying in what can only be described as a dream school, the best days were ahead of me. The classrooms were vibrant and well-decorated, and the teachers employed engaging teaching methods that further fueled my passion for learning.

I performed well; however, due to late schooling, my admission into a regular school was a little challenging. Aasraa had a solution for that too! I was enrolled in its NIOS -OBE center in class 6, an open schooling platform where I could catch up on my educational levels through distance education. I continued my studies there until class 8.

Aasraa then admitted me to Government Girls Inter College, Rajpur Road and kept me in their shelter home. I was finally in a school...with large classrooms, a huge school bell in its courtyard, and lots of friends! Waking up every day knowing the school is waiting for me was the best feeling in the world.

Time has flown by so quickly. Last year, I passed my class 10 exams with 83.6%. My journey from a student who had to leave school to someone who dreams of studying at Delhi University and becoming an IAS officer has been nothing short of a roller coaster ride but well worth it ... all because of Aasraa.

I now know that my goals are achievable; thanks to my teachers and to Aasraa for believing in my abilities. I am grateful for the opportunity to dream big and make those dreams a reality.

CHAIRPERSON'S MESSAGE

It has been an exhilarating year at Aasraa!

We remain focused on education as catalyst for social change and have taken on more partner schools with Government. With focused capacity building, better TLM and improved technology we have raised the education level in these schools. Aasraa now operates in 80 centres spread across Uttarakhand.

Aasraa has just turned 15! We have impacted the lives of 25,000 children, their families and communities. There are currently almost 11,000 children under the Aasraa umbrella in 3 districts of Uttarakhand, making the journey from street to school to skills!

In April 2023, to bridge the gap between education and employment, Aasraa launched its new Skills Training Centre, SkillAbility. Skill training has never been more important. In a post covid, changing world, relevant skills training is an urgent challenge. The very first year of this program, starting with 4 verticals and adding 2 mid-year, we were able to reach 523 youth!

We have an exciting new addition to our fleet of technology enabled mobile learning centres. This has brought the total number of tech-enabled mobile education buses up to 9! This was donated by the Labour Department of Uttarakhand, to specifically target children of migrant workers at construction sites who rarely have any education at all.

The Career Guru Program trained secondary school teachers in career counselling throughout Uttarakhand. Working in partnership with Chevening and the Education Department of Uttarakhand, Aasraa ran The Master Training program to train 200 teachers and reach over 1000 students in 7 districts of Uttarakhand, identifying children's individual strength and aptitude to make higher education choices and focus on career paths.

Aasraa has focused on scholarship programs for higher education. Aasraa team was empanelled to award 120 scholarships to Girl students in the Udham Singh Nagar district for higher education degree and diploma courses. This brings the number of students at Aasraa in higher education to over 200.

Aasraa's School Quality Enhancement Program model has remained a crucial aspect of Aasraa's intervention through a rigorous capacity building program for the teachers, quality teaching- learning resources and access to computer literacy through Aasraa Mobile Computer Labs. Aasraa added 6 more government schools under SQEP.

The Tinkering lab promotes critical thinking and problem solving. It's a favourite class for children where they can find practical solutions of everyday problems. It will provide the base of the STEM learning program outlined by the NEP in our partner schools.

Aasraa has a new office! We have been blessed to be able to bring all Aasraa verticals under one roof onto one premises. It has allowed us to concentrate our activities and synergies between departments.

Aasraa also has a new Special Needs Centre. With almost 80 special needs children identified through Aasraa programs, we needed larger premises to offer proper individual care programs. The new premises has also provided space to start a skills training program for our children with special needs.

I am also pleased to share that Aasraa has been awarded The Mahatma Award 2023 for Social Good and Impact (for Non Profit), Indian CSRAward for Top 20 Best NGOs of the Year, Uttarakhand Educators Award 2023, and the Nari Shakti-Raashtra Shakti Award 2023.

Thank you all for being on this amazing journey with us. We could not have done it without you; your love, your care and your sponsorship.

We are here to build a better India, an inclusive India, at whose table, underserved children have a seat.

A special thanks to all the members of the Aasraa family whose dedication, passion and commitment to making our children's lives better brings us closer to success each day. They make the dream a reality!


LAUNCH OF SKILLABILITY

Many underserved youths are unable to realize their potential due to a lack of essential skills. This leads to a significant dropout rate after completing school, leaving many young individuals unemployed as they are unable to access better job opportunities.

Recognizing the critical need for skills training among underserved youth, Aasraa, in collaboration with Gyan Jyoti Trust, inaugurated the Skills Training Centre in April 2023. The primary aim of this initiative is to bridge the gap between education, skills, and employability, thereby empowering marginalized youth.

The center currently offers five vocational courses and palcement in Hotel Management, Cutting and Tailoring, Computer courses and DOJO. We will soon launch the Automative Service Technician Course.

Since its establishment in April 2023, over 500 trainees have already enrolled.

5 THE CAREER GURU COUNSELLING AND GUIDANCE PROGRAM

Initiated on 19th December 2022, The Career Guru Program focused on mentoring 200 government teachers from diverse districts of Uttarakhand. The program, consisting of 8 virtual sessions, aimed to equip teachers with essential skills to guide over 1000 students from government schools in the state.

Additionally, a Tamanna Aptitude Test, developed in collaboration with NCERT, was administered to 500 senior secondary students, facilitating the identification of strengths and abilities for informed decision-making regarding future education and career paths.

The event featured an address by Dr. Sati, setting the tone for the Master Teacher Training by iDreamCareer, attended by 10 school teachers and 50 students. A Career Guidance Session was conducted, culminating in the felicitation of 10 teachers for their outstanding contributions.

This initiative emphasized the importance of empowering government teachers as Master Mentors to counsel and guide students from underserved backgrounds. The collaboration with career counselling trainers from iDreamCareer and sponsorship from the Chevening Alumni Programme Fund enhanced the impact of the program.

Aasraa's third Gyaan Manthan Mela—a Science and Math Fest was organized by the children and teachers of Aasraa Trust in December 2023. The festival aims to foster curiosity and innovation among children, showcasing their creativity and hands-on talent.

The fair was opened by Ms. Vandana Garbiyal, Academic Research Director - Department of School Education, Uttarakhand. The guest conducted a walkthrough of the science models, showcasing the innovative projects developed by the participating children.

97 children from 26 Aasraa centres made models ranging from rainwater harvesting to a working model of the Chandrayan 3.

The models were filled with providing solutions to real life problems such as the Drone Detection System to the Smart Railway Accident Prevention Project.



Malnutrition breeds illiteracy. A child sitting in a classroom, on an empty stomach growling, is not learning.

Every day, Aasraa's centralized kitchen prepares hot and fresh meals for all the children in Dehradun under its care.

Over 2,000 children are served nutritious meals daily, delivered to each center via dedicated food trucks.

Children attending our day programs receive breakfast and lunch, while those residing in our Shelter Homes enjoy a nourishing three-course meal prepared by professional chefs at our centralized kitchen.

As a member of the Uttarakhand District Task Force, Aasraa has made a significant impact in the fight against child labor.

Over the past year, from April 2023 to March 2024, Aasraa along with other members of DTF, has successfully rescued 89 children from the clutches of labor.

Out of these, 6 children have been integrated in Aasraa run prorgams.
